Professor Henry Russell Hitchcock of Wesleyan University, well known authority on modern architecture, will give an illustrated lecture at the Museum of Modern Art on Thursday, January 26th, at 8.30 P. M. on The Golden Age of American Architecture.

The lecture is given in connection with the Exhibition of Early Modern Architecture: Chicago, 1870-1910, which is being held at the Museum of Modern Art until February 23rd.

Professor Hitchcock is the author of two books on modern architecture and monographs on such men as Frank Lloyd Wright and J. J. P. Oud.

His lecture will be illustrated by lantern slides showing the story of the discovery of steel and its position in the amazing development of the skyscraper. Members of the Museum will be admitted to the lecture free of charge.
