The opening of the retrospective Exhibition of the works of Maurice Sterne at the Museum of Modern Art has been postponed until February 15th, according to announcement made today at the Museum.

This will be the first one-man exhibition of the work of an American artist to be held at the Museum of Modern Art. Paintings, sculpture, and drawings covering the whole period of Sterne's artistic activity and including many recent works, produced during Mr. Sterne's recent six months stay in Anticoli-Corrado, Italy, will be shown.

The Exhibition of American Painting and Sculpture, 1862-1932, will be extended until February 8th. Whistler's "Portrait of the Artist's Mother", which has been a feature of the Exhibition, will be on view until February 5th. After that date this painting begins a tour arranged by the Museum of Modern Art of important Museums throughout the west and middle west.

The Exhibition of Early Modern Architecture, Chicago, 1870-1910, now being shown on the fourth floor of the Museum, will continue through the first weeks of the Sterne Exhibition.
