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TALK ON AMATUER ARTISTS TO BE HELD AT MUSEUM

Art for Sunday Painters will be the subject of a discussion led by Will Barnet on Saturday, March 21, at 2:00 p.m. at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street. Mr. Barnet is a painter and graphic artist and teacher at the Art Students League, Yale University, Cooper Union, Birch-Wathen School and the People's Art Center of the Museum of Modern Art.

In his talk Mr. Barnet will discuss the role of the amatuer in art today and the ways in which the amatuer can best satisfy his own creative interests. The talk will attempt to present a basic concept of teaching amatuers and will try to clear up much of the confusion that exists between the aims of the amatuer and of the professional artist. Because the amatuer is often exploited in many ways, special emphasis will be 1 id on a sound philosophy of instruction as compared with hobby or dilettante methods.
