An unusual exhibition called "EXPERIMENTAL DRAWINGS IN CHILDREN" will open with a public reception on Friday evening, March 23, from 8 to 11 pm at the Tennoch Public Library. Presented as a public service by the Trustees for the newly proposed Art Center at Northern New Jersey, the exhibition will remain in view at the library through Saturday, April 4, and will be open from 9am to 5pm in the afternoon and from 7pm to 9pm in the evening. No admission will be charged and the public is cordially invited to attend.

The exhibition is a visual presentation of the fundamental of creative thinking, as contrasted with practical methods still prevalent from the past. Through a series of photographic panels, made by leading photographers, original paintings and sculpture by children, caricatures, transparencies and three-dimensional color, sculpture, it describes the hypotheses and plays in the growing-up process for all children. The exhibition was prepared under the supervision of Victor A. Wallis, Director of the Department of Education of the Museum of Modern Art, New York, and Director of the Commission on Art Education, a national organization of art teachers representing all levels of education from preschool through college. It was prepared at the Museum of Modern Art last year as part of the Museum's 25th Anniversary celebration.

The following advisory of our exhibition has been published in our letter dated March 21, 1964, which was prepared for the Trustees of Northern New Jersey, Newark to serve the County, through, January 1st, 1964, by our committee. The entire exhibition is at the Tennoch Public Library, 1000 Broadway, Newark, New Jersey, and has already attracted the attention of the public.
