WONDERFUL TIMES, 1950 GERMAN FILM, AT MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

<u>Wonderful Times</u> (<u>Herriliche Zeiten</u>), a compilation of newsreel and story-film footage since the turn of the century, will be shown at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, January 5 - 8; twice daily at 3 and 5:30.

Produced and directed by Gunter Neumann, the 1950 film begins lightly and amusingly, becoming more serious as events move toward World War II. Willi Fritsch, the only actor photographed specifically for the film, gives intermittent commentary.

Among those who appear briefly are Enrico Caruso, Charles Chaplin, Bernard Shaw, Eitler, Mussolini, Franz Joseph, Greta Garbo, Von Hindenburg, Pavlova, John D. Rockefeller, Arturo Toscanini, Kaiser Wilhelm, Woodrow Wilson, Josephine Baker and Rudolph Valentino.
