### DIMENSIONS 1959, THREE LECTURES AT MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

In <u>Dimensions 1959</u>, a series of three evening lectures in the Museum of Modern Art auditorium, ll West 53 Street, a theologian, a scientist and a psychiatrist will investigate the possible interrelationships between their fields and the arts of our time. Beginning February 17 and continuing on alternate Tuesdays, the lectures, presented by the Junior Council of the Museum, will start promptly at 8:30 p.m. Question and answer periods will follow.

Dr. Paul Tillich, eminent Protestant theologian, will open the series on February 17 with a talk on "Ultimate Reality and Art." On March 3 Professor Harlow Shapley, noted astronomer and former director of the Harvard Observatory, will speak on "Galaxies and Goals." On March 17 the well-known psychiatrist, Dr. Theodore Reik, author of Listening with the Third Ear, will discuss "Looking and Listening."

Admission tickets for <u>Dimensions 1959</u>, on sale at the Front Desk of the Museum or by check addressed to the Museum of Modern Art, are \$3.50 for a gingle lecture or \$9.00 for the series of three. Prices for students and Museum members are \$2.50 per lecture or \$6.75 for the series.
