WOMEN'S DENTAL AUXILLARY VISITS MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

The Women's Auxillary of the Queens County Dental Society accompanied by their President, Mrs. Marion Zarnow and Mrs. Shirley Gorelich, a member and artist, visited the Museum of Modern Art in New York today (Wed., Feb. 17) as part of their club's cultural activities.

After lunching in the Members' Penthouse and looking at the New Talent show, painting and sculpture by Peter Voulkos, they met Mr. A. L. Chanin, the Museum lecturer, who conducted them on a tour of the Museum.

Among the exhibitions they saw were paintings and sculptures from the Museum's Collection, arranged chronologically to give a history of modern European and American art from 1875 to the present, a selection of chairs, china and household objects from the Design Collection, also covering about the same period, and a sampling from the Print and Photography Collections.

The major loan exhibition on view which they visited, is recent paintings and sculptures by 16 Americans. This is one of a series of similar American exhibitions presented by the Museum periodically. They also saw the Art Lending Retrospective, an exhibition of 58 paintings, sculptures, prints and drawings sold through the Museum's rental service.

They examined a  $13'7" \ge 6' \ge 5'2"$  high model of the additional wing the Museum plans to build at the conclusion of its 30th Anniversary Fund Drive and walked through the Sculpture Carden and saw an outdoor show, three structures by Buckminster Fuller; a radome and two experimental projects.
