Mrs. John D. Rockefeller, 3rd. President of the Museum of Modern Art.

Mrs. Rockefeller has been a trustee of the Museum since 1953 and was Chairman of the Board prior to becoming President in 1959. She was the first Chairman of the Junior Council and the first President of the International Council at the Museum.

Louis J. Marion. Senior Auctioneer and Executive Vice-President of Parke-Bernet Galleries, Inc.

Mr. Marion has been an auctioneer for Parke-Bernet since 1937. In 1927 he started work there as an apprentice. He is considered one of the top appraisers in the art world.

Nathan L. Halpern. President of TNT - Theater Network Television, Inc.

Mr. Halpern developed the plan for this first national closed-circuit art auction after providing local closed-circuit facilities at the Parke-Bernet Galleries on several occasions. He has pioneered in applying closed-circuit to a variety of uses including sports events, gala entertainment affairs, political fund raising as well as business and industry.

Mrs. E. Powis Jones. Co-Chairman of the Auction Committee.

Mrs. Jones is Co-Chairman of the Museum of Modern Art's Junior Council, a group of volunteers which operates the Art Lending Service and sponsors special exhibitions and lectures supplementing the Museum's regular program. She has been a member of the group for the past ten years.

Mrs. Louise R. Smith. Co-Chairman of the Auction Committee.

Mrs. Smith is a member of the International Council at the Museum of Modern Art, a nationwide organization of art patrons and community leaders which sponsors international exchange of the visual arts. A well known collector, Mrs. Smith is a member of the Museum's Collection Committee.
