The Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53rd Street, New York City, will remain open on Thursday evenings until 10 p.m. from June 9 throughout the Summer. Dinner and light refreshments will be served in the Garden Restaurant overlooking the Sculpture Court from 6 to 8:30 p.m. on those nights.

During the Summer, Art Nouveau paintings, sculptures, prints, books, posters, design objects, and furniture from fourteen countries will be shown in a major loan exhibition. Selections from the Museum's Collections of paintings, drawings, prints, photographs, and design objects will also be on view in a specially installed show called "A Bid For Space". Three revolutionary structures by Buckminster Fuller will be on view in the garden. "New Spanish Painting and Sculpture" will be on the first floor after July 11 and a model and plans for the new building the Museum plans to build at the end of its 30th Anniversary Fund Drive. Sculpture from the Collection is on view in the garden and in the third floor gallery.

A popular film will be shown in the Museum auditorium each Thursday evening at 8:00 p.m.; included in the series are such favorites as Blood and Sand, with Rudolph Valentino, Flesh and the Devil, with Greta Garbo and John Gilbert, and Mae West's She Done Him Wrong.
