selection of sculptures, watercolors, drawings, prints, and photographs from the recent shibition "Portraits from the Museum Collections" has been reinstalled in the auditorium allery of the Museum of Modern Art for the duration of the summer.

Among the seventy-one works on view through September 18 are several photographs from the Museum Collectionshung with other portraits of the same sitter in different media. Alf-portraits by Kokoschka, Grozeo and Marcel Duchamp may be compared with their camera Henesses by Hugo Erfurth, Edward Weston and Man Ray. Additional subjects represented in averal media including photography are Father D\*Arey, in mosaic by Elsa Schmid and a photograph by Alfred Eisenstaedt; John Marin, sculpted by Lachaise and photographed by hving Fenn; J. Robert Oppenheimer, photographed by Arnold Neuman and drawn by Ben Shahn; libert Schweitzer, drawn by Frederick Franck and photographed by W. Eugene Smith; Isadora hman, drawn by Abraham Walkowitz and Segonsac, etched by John Sloan and photographed by mold Genthe and Edward Steichen; Alfred Stieglitz, caricatured in collage by Arthur Dove and photographed by W. Eugene Smith, Edward Steichen and Cartier-Bresson.

Also on view are self-portraits by Bernard Buffet, Lovis Corinth, Otto Dix, Erich Mckel, Jules Pascin, Charles Sheeler and, in seven studies of himself, the German painter, Mu Beckmann.

The subjects of other portraits include three poets, Dante, Gérard de Nerval and Rudelaire; the painters Camille Pissarro and Tal Coat; the dancer Nijinsky; the screen Num Pola Negri; the architect, Frederick Kiesler, and the art dealer, Curt Valentin.

The exhibition has been reinstalled by William S. Lieberman, director of the original whibition.
