Odilon Redon: Idealism and Symbolism, an illustrated lecture by Dr. Robert Goldwater, will be given in the Museum of Modern Art auditorium, 11 West 53 Street, on Thursday, January 11, at 8:30 p.m. Dr. Goldwater is Professor at the Institute of Fine Arts, New York University, and Director of the Museum of Primitive Art, New York.

Tickets, \$1.50 for Museum members, \$2 for non-members, include admission to Museum galleries, open Thursday evenings until 10. Dinner and light refreshments are available.

Dr. Goldwater's lecture is given in connection with the Museum's Redon, Moreau and Bresdin exhibition, on view through January 28. He will discuss "the nature and quality of Redon's imagination as revealed through his subjects, the sources of his art in the realism of his mid-century generation, its connection with the symbolism of the end of the century, and its consistency in both the early black and white work and the later paintings."
