MARCH OPENING

March 14 -May 6 FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT. A major exhibition of 250 drawings by Frank Lloyd Wright, surveying the architect's work from 1895 to his death in 1959. Selected by Wilder Green, Assistant Director of the Department of Architecture and Design, and Arthur Drexler, Director, with the generous cooperation of the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation. The great majority of the drawings to be shown are perspective renderings ranging through every kind of building Frank Lloyd Wright designed. Also included are elevations; studies for decoration; designs for automobiles, helicopters, and coffee cups; and some technical details of special interest. (First floor)

April through July 50 DRAWINGS. An exhibition of recent and outstanding acquisitions held in conjunction with the announcement by Mrs. John D. Rockefeller, 3rd of the Paul J. Sachs Committee on Drawings and Prints.
