The Museum of Modern Art will honor film writer-producer-director

Carl Foreman on Thursday, March 23rd, when three of his films will be shown

on the same day.

The program, announced by Adrienne Mancia, Curator in the Department of Film, includes 3 screenplays by Foreman: "The Men" (1950), starring Marlon Brando and Teresa Wright; "The Key" (1958), starring Sophia Loren, Trevor Howard and William Holden, directed by Carol Reed; and "The Guns of Navarone" (1961), with Gregory Peck, David Niven, Anthony Quinn and Irene Papas.

In addition, two other acclaimed Foreman vehicles will be presented:
"Born Free" (1966), which the writer also produced, to be shown on March
25th and 26th; and his classic and unsurpassed Western, "High Noon," starring
Gary Cooper, who received an Academy Award for his performance in it. "High
Noon," to be shown on April 1st and April 2nd, also marked the film debut
of Grace Kelly.

Foreman, who received five Academy Award nominations for screenwriting, has also been honored with the Laurel Award, the highest award for writing accomplishment given by the Writers Guild of America, and that organization's Valentine Davies Award for his humanitarian contribution.

In addition, while he lived in Great Britain, Mr. Foreman was president of that country's Writers Guild; he was a founding governor of the British National Film Institute, a governor of the British National Film School, a fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, and appointed a Commander of the British Empire by Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

Mr. Foreman now heads his own production company, High Noon Productions, and is working on the Universal Pictures Studio lot.
