THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART'S 1980 DRAWINGS ACQUISITIONS TO GO ON VIEW

RECENT ACQUISITIONS: DRAWINGS, a selection of the works on paper newly acquired by The Museum of Modern Art through purchase or donation will be on view in the third-floor Sachs Galleries from March 19 through June 2, 1981. These acquisitions, most of which were made during the first year of John Elderfield's tenure as Director of the Museum's Department of Drawings, fill historical gaps in the Collection or complement existing works. Mr. Elderfield is director of the exhibition.

Ranging from drawings executed in traditional media to those that employ technical innovations, this selection includes works by early modern masters, established contemporary figures, and little-known younger artists. The earliest acquisition to be exhibited will be the outstanding <u>Le Mercure de Pigalle</u> (ca. 1890) by Paul Cézanne, the first pencil drawing by this artist to enter the Department's Collection, though it joins eight previously acquired Cézanne watercolors. Recently acquired works by early modernists include those by Carlo Carra (the first of this artist's work to enter the Collection), Natalia Gontcharova, Henri Matisse and Paul Klee. School of Paris works by Pablo Picasso, Fernand Léger, Joan Miro, Albert Gleizes and Robert and Sonia Delaunay will also be shown, as will works by artists associated with Dada and the Surrealist movements:

collages by Kurt Schwitters and drawings and gouaches by Matta, Man Ray and Yves Tanguy.

A set of major American works will also be on view, including three Joseph Cornell collages, an exquisite Arthur Dove in watercolor and silverleaf, Charles Demuth's <u>Female Acrobats</u> of 1916 (joining the <u>Male Acrobats</u> of 1919 already in the Collection), and drawings by William Baziotes and Ben Shahn.

Drawings by living artists will also be exhibited, including work by such established figures as Michael Heizer, Jasper Johns, Alex Katz and Robert Rauschenberg, as well as artists who will be represented in the Collection for the first time, among them Stanley Boxer, Peter de Francia, Richard Haas, Kenneth Martin and Myron Stout. Finally, among the most recent acquisitions are oil stick, craypas, handmade paper, and pastel works by James Biederman, Lois Lane, Kikuo Saito and Joyce Weinstein, respectively, all of which were completed in 1980.
