

In addition to the illustrations and an introduction by Mr. McShine, the catalog contains biographical information on the artists, selected individual and group exhibition lists and a bibliography of related publications. Measuring  $11\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$  inches, this handsome book is an indispensable guide to aspects of current art and a fascinating report on the extraordinary vitality of the visual art of the present. The catalog, which is being published (paperbound only) and distributed by The Museum of Modern Art, will sell for \$17.50 until September 1, 1984; \$25.00 thereafter.
