VOCAL WORKS BY STRAVINSKY PERFORMED AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

Friday and Saturday, August 10 and 11, 7:30 p.m. Sculpture Garden open from 6:00 to 10:00 p.m.

The Museum of Modern Art's SUMMERGARDEN series continues on August 10 and 11 with artists from The Juilliard School performing several vocal works by Igor Stravinsky (1882-1971). SUMMERGARDEN, which offers free weekend evenings in the Museum's Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden, is made possible by PaineWebber Group Inc. This week, ten artists of The Juilliard School perform the following vocal works and musical pieces:
