CONTEMPORARY GERMAN FILMMAKING PRESENTED AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

On the occasion of the reunification of Germany, The Museum of Modern Art is presenting two German film programs and one symposium on contemporary German filmmaking during January 1991. The program and schedule are as follows:

RECENT FILMS FROM GERMANY January 11 - 15 and 26 - 31

Since 1972, the Museum has presented thirteen surveys of new films from the Federal Republic of Germany. The fourteenth program, taking place three months after Germany's reunification, features ten films completed over the past two years in what were formerly East and West Germany. It includes the last narrative films made on either side of the Berlin Wall, as well as two documentaries made in 1990 about the impending reunification. RECENT FILMS FROM GERMANY provides a timely, if not historic, opportunity to view independently made films, realized under two different social and economic systems. The complete program is shown twice.

The series highlights Frank L. Beyer's satire *Track of Stones*, which was made in East Germany in 1966 and banned until 1990. Other films in the program are Heiko Schier's *Wedding* (1990), following the lives of three young Berliners; Peter Kahane's *The Architects* (1990), about young architects in East Germany; Helmut Dziuba's *Forbidden Love* (1990), involving the alleged corruption of a minor; Hark Bohm's *Crossing Borders* (1989), recounting a young man's release from prison in the Soviet sector of Berlin; and Johann Feindt and Helga Reidemeister's *In the Splendor of Happiness* (1990), the first documentary film about the fall of the Berlin Wall.

RECENT FILMS FROM GERMANY has been organized by Laurence Kardish and Adrienne Mancia, curators, Department of Film, The Museum of Modern Art. It is made possible through the support of the Export-Union des Deutschen Films, Munich.

SYMPOSIUM: GERMAN FILM AFTER REUNIFICATION January 15, 6:00 - 7:30 p.m.

In conjunction with RECENT FILMS FROM GERMANY, a symposium on contemporary German filmmaking is moderated by professor, author, and historian Amos Vogel. Panelists include directors Michael Gwisdek, Reinhard Hauff, Harriet Eder, Thomas Kufus, Helke Misselwitz, Helga Reidemeister, and Dietmar Hochmuth, and screenwriter Thomas Knauf.

The symposium is sponsored in part by Goethe House New York, the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the Contemporary Arts Council of The Museum of Modern Art.

HEIMAT

January 17 - 25

Heimat (1984), an epic film by Eric Reitz, chronicles a multi-branched family in a fictional town in Germany between 1912 and 1982. Nearly sixteen hours long, the eleven parts of Heimat are divided into eight separate programs and are shown twice between January 17 and 25. The presentation of Heimat was organized by Laurence Kardish in cooperation with Goethe House New York and InterNationes, Bonn.
