We would like to give you an update about all of the special summer music programs happening at MoMA over the upcoming summer months:

Summergarden

Every summer, The Museum of Modern Art hosts the annual Summergarden musical program in the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden. This year the free concert series will take place Sunday evenings July 11, 18, 25 and August 26 and is once again a collaboration between MoMA, The Juilliard School, and Jazz at Lincoln Center. The young virtuosi of the New Juilliard Ensemble will perform new chamber music that has never been heard in New York, by composers from various parts of the world writing in a vast range of styles. Jazz at Lincoln Center selects cutting-edge jazz artists, each of whose concerts will emphasize original works and include at least one world premiere.

Summergarden is free and seating is on a first come, first served basis. The Sculpture Garden opens for seating at 7:00 p.m., and the concerts will start at 8:00 p.m. and run approximately one hour to 90 minutes. After the performance is over, the Sculpture Garden closes at 10:00 p.m. In the event of rain, concerts will be held in The Agnes Gund Garden Lobby, and the Museum's Lobby entrance on 54 Street will open at 7:30 p.m.

MoMA Nights

Additionally MoMA Nights will also enrich the musical life of New York City this summer by presenting concert performances from an international and eclectic array of music presented every Thursday evening in July and August. The live music will be presented in the Sculpture Garden, weather permitting, in two series, *Hear Brazil*, held in July and *Hear France*, held in August. Performances will be in two sets, at 5:30 and 7:00 p.m. In the event of rain, the Sculpture Garden will close and music will be presented

in the Roy and Niuta Titus Theater 1 or 2. This series is free with Museum admission and coincides with MoMA's extended Thursday summer hours.

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

We would like to inform you that from Monday, July 19, 2010 through Tuesday, July 20, 2010, there will be an independent film shoot within the MoMA complex and around the exterior. This will involve West 53 and 54 Streets between Fifth and Sixth Avenues.

The film's production team is seeking all necessary permits from New York City for the film shoot, and they provided an approximate schedule of the filming. We, in turn, are passing this information along to you, our community.

Monday, July 19

6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

Between two and four trucks will be positioned along the south side of West 54 Street. The trucks will have their engines turned off and will not be idling. A crew of 15-20 people will unload the trucks, set-up lights, and position cables leading to and inside the MoMA Sculpture Garden.

4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Additional crew members arrive to assist with further equipment set-up in the MoMA Sculpture Garden, positioning all necessary lights, furniture, and décor. Both West 53 and 54 Streets will be used to move equipment and props into the Museum building.

9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. (morning of July 20)

The scene is filmed. There will be film extras positioned in the Garden and lights on inside the Museum's 11 West 53 Street building. While the film is shooting, there will be five or six tractor-trailers and at least two motor homes parked along West 54 Street. These vehicles will not be idling and will run on a generator.

Tuesday, July 20

5:30 a.m.-10:00 a.m.

The film shoot concludes and break-down of the film shoot equipment takes place. Some of the equipment will be taken out of the Museum through the West 54 Street lobby entrance and the Museum loading docks. Trucks will be stationed close to these areas in order to facilitate a quick load-out. The Museum was informed that the production team plans to have everything packed and cleaned up by the afternoon.

As stated above, the film's production team is seeking all appropriate New York City permits in order to carry out this film shoot and will comply with all New York City film site regulations as outlined in the permit they receive.
