Here are some updates from the Government and Community Relations Department at MoMA.

As many of you already know, Eugenia will be away from the office on maternity leave until mid-September, 2011. During this time, we are pleased to inform you that Jeanine Hebert will be assisting our department. Jeanine has a deep appreciation for the arts with vast experience in the textile, home furnishings, and customer

On a different topic, please note that Monday, May 23, 2011 will be a special day for MoMA. On this date, MoMA, MoMA PS1, and Volkswagen will announce a multi-year, multi-project initiative that will support exhibitions at both venues and MoMA's online courses. The announcement will be made at a press conference at 10:00 a.m., and there will be a celebratory dinner party in the Museum that evening hosted by MoMA and Volkswagen. The new partnership includes support for an international contemporary art exhibition to be held at MoMA PS1 in 2013, a series of installations in MoMA's Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden, the exhibition *Francis Alÿs: A Story of Deception*, as well as the donation of two works by artist Francis Alÿs to MoMA's collection. This unprecedented partnership supports MoMA and MoMA PS1's leadership role in contemporary art and culture, with the goal of reaching a diverse and global audience.

The events on May 23 will include the closure of one, and possibly two traffic lanes on West 54th Street. There will be DJ music in the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden during the evening portion of the event. The music is scheduled to stop between 11:45 p.m. and 12:00 a.m.. Tunji Adeniji, Director of Facilities and Safety, and the MoMA team, will be carefully monitoring the sound levels to ensure they are appropriate for our community. We are extremely grateful to our neighbors for your support of MoMA and we will make every effort to ensure that the event on May 23 runs smoothly, ends on time, and causes the least possible amount of disturbance to our neighborhood.

Finally, we are excited about a new fence covering that will soon be installed along the fence of the vacant west lot. At present, there is a black covering on the fences along both West 53rd and West 54th Streets. This will be replaced by a whimsical covering that features MoMA's recent advertising campaign – "I went to MoMA and..." The new fence coverings will be installed in mid-June and will stay up through the summer. Please see image below.

I hope you all had a wonderful July 4th weekend. This neighbor enews contains information about **MoMA Nights** and **Summergarden**, the two exciting music series occurring at MoMA this summer...and starting tonight! Following is a brief synopsis of each program series and a chronological listing of the performances:

Summergarden

The Museum of Modern Art established Summergarden in 1971 to enhance the artistic life of New York City during the summer. In keeping with MoMA's history of presenting jazz and classical music in The Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden, this year's Summergarden series once again welcomes the participation of two constituents from Lincoln Center—The Juilliard School and Jazz at Lincoln Center, with concerts on alternating Sundays. New Music for New York presents four evenings of adventurous contemporary music, with premieres each night. Juilliard concerts are performed by members of The New Juilliard Ensemble, under the artistic direction of Joel Sachs, who has assembled two distinctive programs of contemporary compositions, all of which are enjoying their New York or Western Hemisphere premieres. Jazz at Lincoln Center has selected two leading jazz ensembles whose concerts emphasize original works, each with a world premiere. Admission to Summergarden is free. Chairs are limited, and seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. The Sculpture Garden may close if attendance reaches maximum capacity. Entrance is through the Sculpture Garden gate on 54th Street between Fifth and Sixth avenues. The Sculpture Garden opens at 7:00 p.m., and concerts start at 8:00 p.m. In the event of rain, concerts will be held indoors in The Agnes Gund Garden Lobby. The entrance is also on 54th Street between Fifth and Sixth avenues, and doors open at 7:30 p.m.

MoMA Nights

Live music is presented in the Sculpture Garden in two sets (5:30 and 7:00 p.m.). The 2011 series takes an international focus, featuring adventurous musical performers from Africa, South America, China, Indonesia, and beyond. The musicians build on specific national and popular musical traditions—uniting them in inventive hybrid styles, bringing new instruments into standard ensembles, and enlivening the music with distinctive personal approaches. The series is the fourth organized in collaboration with Olivier Conan, programmer and co-owner of Barbès performance space (barbesbrooklyn.com). He also runs Barbès Records and is a founding member of the bands Chicha Libre and Las Rubias del Norte.

Weather permitting; there will be a cash bar (specialty cocktails, draft beer, wine, and nonalcoholic beverages) and seasonal tapas for purchase in the Sculpture Garden. The Garden Bar will sell local *gelati* and *sorbetti*, ice cream sandwiches, cookies, wine, beer, and specialty coffees. Terrace 5, on the fifth floor, will offer an à la carte menu indoors, as well as an "urban picnic"—antipasti, salumi, cheese, and sweets, with optional choice of wine—outdoors on the terrace, with seating's at 5:00 and 7:00 p.m. (reserve at cafes@artfoodny.com and include name, preferred time, number of guests, and phone number). All menus are presented by Executive Chef Lynn Bound. In the event of rain

a bar will be available in The Agnes Gund Garden Lobby, and Terrace 5 will remain open.

Temporary Change to Outdoor Visitor Queuing on Friday Nights

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Recently, you may have noticed the construction taking place around the 1330 Avenue of the Americas building. This construction requires sidewalk closures so pedestrian traffic at the corner of 6 Avenue and 54 Street has been temporarily rerouted from the sidewalk into the south lane of the street (and behind barricades).

Under regular conditions when visitors line up to purchase tickets for the Museum, the outdoor queue runs west along 53 Street, turns the corner and goes north on 6 Avenue, and then east on 54 Street. The visitor line is

always managed by trained MoMA visitor services staff and on most occasions does not reach 54 Street. However, during Target Free Friday Nights when the Museum is open to the public free of charge (4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.) the outdoor queue can extend to 54 Street. Because the southeast corner of 6 Avenue and 54 Street is under construction and the sidewalk is blocked, there would be serious safety concerns on Friday nights if visitors were queued in our typical fashion.

Therefore, please note that starting tomorrow, Friday, October 21, the Museum will change the direction of the Target Free Friday Night outdoor visitor queue. The line will start at the West 54 Street Museum entrance running east on 54 Street, and south along 5 Avenue (if it gets that long). As always, trained MoMA visitor services staff will manage the line providing any necessary breaks to ensure no neighboring entrances/exits are blocked. This includes the entrance to The Gap store and St. Thomas Church.

This is a temporary condition and the Museum will reinstitute its normal queuing operation as soon as the construction concludes. Please feel free to call [212-333-6576](tel:212-333-6576) with any further questions or concerns.

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

As we reported to you in the MoMA Neighbor News email sent on October 20, 2011, the construction project occurring at 1330 Avenue of the Americas has affected the way MoMA can queue Museum visitors. We thank you, our neighbors, for your continued cooperation and understanding on Friday nights as we temporarily use 54 Street to queue visitors during Target Free Friday Nights. As construction at the 1330 building progresses through the upcoming busy holiday season, we must now make a change to our queue procedures involving the Museum's daytime operation for the specific purpose of visitor and pedestrian safety,

Starting this weekend on every morning we are open to the public, the Museum will evaluate sidewalk and street conditions along 6 Avenue and 54 Street to determine which direction is the safest way to queue our visitors. The queue will either run in its normal direction, **west on 53 Street, north on 6 Avenue and east on 54 Street**, or we will reverse the queue and go **east on 53 Street, north on 5 Avenue and west on 54 Street**. Again this decision is one that will have to be made on a day-

to-day basis and will reflect what is the safest path on that particular day for pedestrians and Museum visitors.

This daily assessment policy will remain in effect throughout the sidewalk construction project at the 1330 building. As always, we will have our trained Visitor Services staff outside managing to entire length of the queue and creating breaks in the line wherever it is necessary. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience this might cause and thank you for your cooperation and patience.

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

We are writing to share some operational news with you which we feel is relevant and important to our neighbors. Starting soon, the Museum will begin a major interior project to replace the escalators between the Ground floor and the two lower levels where our film theaters are located. The existing escalators will be removed and replaced by new state-of-the-art escalators. The escalator replacement process is quite involved and will require a significant amount of debris removal and new parts delivery. All related deliveries and pick-ups will be made through the West 54 Street loading docks. The work will begin on January 2, 2012 and over the following four weeks there will be four to six nightly deliveries made to the Museum loading docks between the

hours of 12:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.

We would like to assure you that all loading dock activity pertaining to this project will be done inside the Museum's loading docks and will not occur outside on the street.
