We are writing to inform you that on **Tuesday, May 22, 2012**, The Museum of Modern Art will hold its annual "Party in the Garden" benefit. This event occurs each year and serves the important purpose of raising funds for MoMA's renowned exhibition and education programs.

The Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden will be closed to the public from Friday,

May 18 through Thursday, May 24, 2012. To aid traffic flow during party deliveries and set-up, there will be a south lane closure on West 54 Street between 5th and 6th Avenues on the following dates and times:

Saturday, May 19, 2012, from **4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

Sunday, May 20, 2012, from **7:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m.**

Monday, May 21, 2012, from **7:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m.**

Tuesday, May 22, 2012 from **12:00 a.m.** until Wednesday, May, 23, 2012 at **2:00 p.m.**

The guests to this year's Party in the Garden will enter the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden through the east Garden gate on West 54 Street, starting at approximately 7:00 p.m. There will also be a sidewalk tent placed between the Museum's West 54 Street main Lobby entrance and the east Garden gate.

The Party in the Garden *After-Party* will start at approximately 9:00 p.m. and run until 12:00 a.m. There will be dancing, DJ music, and a featured live performance by the musical star Santigold. ALL music and performances will end at 12:00 a.m. and will be immediately followed by furniture and equipment breakdown. Please note that there will be sound checks in the Sculpture Garden on the afternoon of May 22 from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. before the party officially begins.

We apologize in advance for any disruption caused by this year's Party in the Garden activities.

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

We are writing to inform you that from **April 10 to April 17, 2012** The Museum of Modern Art will be presenting the exhibition performance of German artists Kraftwerk, entitled *Kraftwerk-Retrospective 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8*.

Kraftwerk has had a significant influence on global sound and world image culture. This

exhibition is “a chronological exploration of the sonic and visual experiments of Kraftwerk with a live presentation of their complete repertoire inside the Museum in the Marron Atrium. Each evening consists of a live performance and 3-D visualization of one of Kraftwerk’s studio albums.” This is the very first time Kraftwerk’s entire body of work has been presented live in chronological order. Each performance art piece will begin in the Marron Atrium, inside the Museum, at approximately 8:30 p.m., with the exceptions of Friday, April 13, 2012 and Tuesday, April 17, 2012, when the performance pieces will start at 10:00 p.m.

Tickets are sold out and ticket holders for each performance piece will be queued to the west on West 53 Street between 5th and 6th Avenues and into the Museum’s main Lobby. We do not anticipate a long outdoor queue as tickets for these performance pieces are extremely limited in number. Additionally, please be aware that lights, brighter than usual, might be seen coming from inside the MoMA building during each of the performance pieces.

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

We wanted to share information about this year's summer music programs, **MoMA Nights** and **Summergarten**, the two exciting music series currently underway at MoMA. Following is a brief synopsis of each program series and a chronological listing of the performances:

Summergarten

The Museum of Modern Art established Summergarten in 1971. In keeping with MoMA's history of presenting jazz and classical music in the Sculpture Garden, this year's concert series once again welcomes the participation of The Juilliard School and Jazz at Lincoln Center. Entitled New Music for New York, the series comprises four evenings of adventurous contemporary music, with premieres each night. Juilliard concerts are performed by members of The New Juilliard Ensemble, under the artistic direction of Joel Sachs, who has assembled two distinctive programs of recent compositions, all of which are enjoying their New York premieres. Jazz at Lincoln Center has selected two leading jazz groups whose concerts emphasize original works, each with one world premiere.

Summergarten is free and seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. The Sculpture Garden may close if attendance reaches maximum capacity. Entrance to Summergarten is through the Sculpture Garden gate on West 54 Street between Fifth and Sixth avenues. **The Sculpture Garden opens at 7:00 p.m., and concerts start at 8:00 p.m. and run approximately one hour to 90 minutes.** The Sculpture Garden closes at 10:00 p.m. In the event of rain, concerts will be held in The Agnes Gund Garden Lobby, and the Museum's 54 Street entrance will open at 7:30 p.m. The exhibition galleries are closed during Summergarten.

The Garden Bar sells gelato and seasonal sorbet from Il Laboratorio del Gelato, and homemade treats from Cafe 2 including fresh cookies and ice cream sandwiches. Wine, champagne, American craft beer, specialty coffees, and bottled water are also available for purchase. In the event of rain, refreshments are not available.

MoMA Nights

Every Thursday in July and August, 5:30–8:00 p.m.

See MoMA's collection, visit the summer exhibitions, and enjoy live music in the Sculpture Garden (sets begin at 6:30 p.m.). Regular Museum admission applies.

This year's MoMA Nights music series draws from local and international sources with an eye to the global cross-pollination of styles and genres. A singer from Brazil takes cues from American pop, while a Congolese guitarist forms a breakthrough collaboration in Paris. A tribute to an avant-garde avatar borrows a Japanese form of poetry and involves 100 composers, and a musical legend from Sierra Leone mixes it up with bandmates in Brooklyn. Each of the innovators in this nine-concert series started with a powerful artistic vision and has traveled the globe to realize it.

The series is the fifth organized in collaboration with Olivier Conan, programmer and co-owner of Barbès performance space (barbesbrooklyn.com).

In the event of rain, the Sculpture Garden will close, and music will take place either Theater 2 or Theater 3. Please Note: Sculpture Garden and indoor seating are limited and on a first-come, first-served basis.

Subject: Notice About Upcoming Activities in the Vacant Lot

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

We are writing to inform you about a series of events that will take place in the vacant lot to the west of the Museum. The vacant lot will be used by an outside entity from **Saturday, September 22 to Sunday, October 21, 2012** where they will build temporary dome and tent structures in which to hold events. All associated events and activities will be contained within these temporary structures.

Below is an approximate schedule of activities in the vacant lot:

- September 22, 2012 to October 8, 2012: Delivery and preparation of the temporary dome and tent structures
- October 9, 2012 to October 16, 2012: Private daytime and evening events take place (ranging in size from five to 200 attendees)
- October 17, 2012 to October 21, 2012: All temporary dome and tent structures are dismantled and removed

The event organizer is very sensitive to maintaining the highest level of community quality-of-life and noise mitigation. With this at the forefront, all daily delivery, preparation, and dismantling activities in the lot have been assigned firm start and end times of **9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.**; while subsequent evening events will not run later than **11:30 p.m.**

Additionally, the event organizer will work very closely with the NYPD, Midtown North precinct to obtain all necessary permits and will keep the police officials informed about their activities throughout this entire period. The organizer has also committed to hiring two security officers to be on-site to ensure safety and proper conduct at all times. Again, all temporary structures and event staging will be removed in their entirety at the conclusion of the series of events.
