I have heard from Dr. Heil in San Francisco that you are withdrawing your pictures from the French exhibition. We are planning to have the exhibition here in September, and I heard with dismay that your pictures might not be included.

I am writing immediately to ask if it might not be possible to include them for the showing in Portland, for the exhibition is so immensely strengthened by the things which you have lent.

The Ingres, "Madame Moitessier", and the Delacroix, "Turkish Women in the Bath", as well as the Braque, "Still Life" and the Picasso, "The Reply" were all memorable high lights in the exhibition when I saw it both in San Francisco and in Chicago.

This will be the first time that really great pictures of nineteenth century and contemporary Frenchmen have been shown in the Northwest, and as we are making an important civic event with publicity in the whole Northwest for this show, I am most anxious that really distinguished examples be shown. As you know, Portland may be the last place where the exhibition will be shown, and we would be most happy if you would be so good as to let us include your pictures in it.

I am sorry that I wasn't able to see you when I was in New York last spring, as Mrs. Davis and I both so much enjoyed meeting you when you were in Buffalo some years ago. I was in Buffalo when I was East last spring, and saw with great pleasure the exquisite Renoir which they had gotten from you. It is a superb picture.
