Dear Mr. Rosenberg: I had a talk with Julian Allen at Morgan's with regard to the balance of approximately \$434 in your dollar account with Morgan et Cie. He insists that Morgan's cannot pay out the balance to you without the approval of the French Government and that the latter has refused a license on the ground that you have funds in America sufficient to maintain yourself and your family. Mr. Allen, in response to a question I put to him, admitted that Morgan et Cie has assets in the United States. I told Mr. Allen that dependent upon a case I now have in my office which is awaiting decision in the courts, I was giving consideration to an action against Morgan et Cie by attaching its funds here in order to collect the balance due you. that Morgan, of course, would not be offended by any such action but would test out the question as to whether the French decrees have any binding effect upon the American courts in a case such as yours where you are here and your balance was in a dollar account and the French bank, such as Morgan et Cie, has dollars in America. The fact is that I represent a client in a case similar to yours and when the decision comes down I will communicate with you and rediscuss the matter. I am writing this letter on behalf of Paul Rosenberg & Company, prospective tenant of the entire building at 16 East 57th Street, New York City, pursuant to Article Twenty-fourth of the proposed lease to be entered into by and between The Carden Corporation, as landlord, and Paul Rosenberg & Company, as tenant. Paul Rosenberg & Company desires to make the following alterations in the aforementioned building, and hereby requests your consent thereto.

- 1. Remove the skull from the facade above the show window.
- 2. Erect a glass partition approximately 6 feet long just inside the entrance to the building and erect swinging doors at the end of this partition. The purpose of this alteration is to create a small vestibule inside the main entrance to the building.
- 3. Remove front door of building and replace with an iron door. It is possible that the tenant will not desire to make this alteration.
- 4. Attach a sign of approximately 20" by 16" to the concrete pillar at the left of the main entrance.
- 5. Hang a small sign inside the show window, such sign to contain the name Paul Rosenberg & Company.
- 6. Erect partitions in the northwest corner of the hall on the first floor in order to set off a small office. These partitions will be approximately 7 feet high and will be made of wood.
 - 7. Install a toilet and a washroom in the basement.
