Dear Mr. Rosenberg:

This is in response to your letter of October 3, 1942 in which you requested me to give you an opinion as to your rights against E. S. Herrmann, general agent for Braun & Co., on the basis of the facts set forth in your letter to me.

A thorough research of the law relevant to the facts has been made and I have a complete opinion in my files. However, I believe my conclusions will serve as a guide to you. They are as follows:

- l. As owner of the painting and assignee of the right to reproduce the painting, you have a common law property right in such right of reproduction.
- 2. Your common law property right is limited to determining whether the painting may be published and if published when, where, by whom and in what form.
- 3. Your grant of the right of reproduction to the Paris publisher and the actual reproduction of the painting and the sale of such reproductions, constituted a publication of the painting.
- productions is an independent third party disassociated with the Paris publisher, no cause of action to enjoin the New York publisher exists.
- New York publisher is acting as the agent or representative of the Paris publisher and is publishing the reproductions under the authority of the agreement between you and the Paris publisher, such reproductions constitute a breach of contract or a breach of the terms of the license.

In such latter event, you may maintain an action in equity to enjoin the further distribution of the reproductions made from a reproduction based, not upon your literary property in the painting, but upon your contractual rights; such action to be brought against the Paris publisher and the New York publisher, as its agent and servant, on the theory that no adequate remedy at law exists and that you will suffer irreparable injury from the continued publication of the reproductions.

7. In such an action, being in the position of demanding equitable relief, you would have to do equity and, therefore, would eventually have to make available to the New York publisher, as the French publisher's agent or servant, the original painting so that it may obtain the benefits of the license agreement.

Dear Mr. Bienstock,

I once authorized the publisher Braum & Cie. to make a reproduction of a painting by Picasso.

I have recently come accross a reproduction of this reproduction and I have written the publisher of this second reproduction, of which correspondence I am enclosing copies.

You can see from the correspondence that I and Picasso did give authorization to reproduce in colours from the original which, usually, does not show the original colours truly, the result being that a reproduction in colours of such a first reproduction, is most horrible and does great injustice to the painting, hurting its eputation and naturally myself, as the owner.

I have decided to put a stop to this practice, if possible, as it is not only detrimental to the picture but dishonest as well in so far as no royalties whatsoever are paid to any of the legitimate interests in the original painting.

Will you give this matter some thought and I shall call you next week to find if something can be done about this.

In February 1940, in Paris, I published a catalogue raisonné of the works of Camille Pissarro. In March of that same year I made a contract with a man by the name of Mr. Weber, residing at 25 rue la Boëtie, Paris. By the terms of this contract he had the right to buy 200 copies of this book on Pissarro as well as unother book, also published by me, the catalogue raisonné of the works of Cézanne, done in 1937 or 1938, on condition that he buy firm 100 copies of the first book.

I have received from Paris a letter saying that in vertue of his contract he has received authorization to take 200 copies of the aforementioned Pisserro. I have not been paid for the books he has taken which were payable after their sale. It happens that I have just heard that copies of this book have come over here through Switzerland. An American book-dealer has made me a firm offer for one copy at \$50.00, copy which I sold to Mr. Weber for FRs. 550.00 the equivalent of \$9.00 at the rate of exchange of that time.

It is my belief that the dollars received in payment mean Swiss francs sent to Paris and that in this fashion the Germans receive foreign currency. Will you please be good enough to examine this matter and let me know if it is in my interest to stop these transactions or if it is wiser to keep it quiet in order that the pictures belonging to me and taken by the Germans may find their way to this country or to South America.

I am enclosing the card received from the book-dealer, offering me the book on Pissarro. However, I want to add that this book-dealer is a very honorable man and I do not wish to create any difficulties for him.

My brother, Edward Assenberg who resides in Cannes, Alpes Maritimes, France, cabled me that by a decree of February 25rd, 1942 I had been denationalized and all my property could, in consequence, be confiscated.

I have a right to fight against this decree and as a certain time limit is given to those coming under this decree I have to correspond by cable with my brother in order to give him all the information he needs for the lawyer handling my case. Naturally these cable expenses run very high and my brother is unfortunately not in a position to pay for them. The rates for cables is very high in France. Therefore, I would like to be able to send my brother (by cable) the counter-value of \$50.00 to cover what he has already paid for and for those he will have to send.

Would you be kind enough to ask the Federal Reserve Bank to issue me a license in this respect as soon as possible as you understand I have to protect a very large amount of property and have very little time to do it in. To help you in this matter I am enclosing copy of the cables I received from my brother concerning the whole thing.
