There exist three pictures by Claude Monet of the same date and with red boats. One, much smaller - about 65x55 cm. - which we sold to Mrs. Brooks, an american residing in Paris forty years ago. Another version of the same size without the Caillebotte house which is on the left and with part of the wall of the building on the right. This one we sold to Mr. H. J. Laroche. It was sold at auction in 1925 and bought by a Mr. Essend for FRS.480,000 + 15%, making a total of FRS.552,000. The rate of exchange being at that time FRs.25 to the dellar, it came to \$22,080.

The red house on the left is Mr. Caillebotto's house. He was en intimate friend of the Expressionist painters and that year he not Manet, Monet and Remoir. There is quite a long and interesting story concerning Mr. Caillebotte's collection which he left to the French Government. It was refused and only after long negociations helf of the collection was accepted and placed in a small room of difficult access in the Luxenbourg Museum. How, however, all of these pictures are to be seen in the spacious rooms of the Louvre Museum.

The famous picture by Manet representing Claude Monet in his boat and which is now in a german museum, was painted the same year as well as a scene at Argentouil: boat with white sail, now in the Courtauld Collection in London, and two other pictures representing a white boat with sail on which two figures are standing. Of these two latter, one was painted by Reneir and the other by Monet.

Monet also painted other pictures of the river Seine at Argenteuil and this period is considered as the very best of his work.

At our knowledge, "Los Bâteaux Rouges" has never been exhibited.

It belonged to a gentleman who never lent his pictures and who possessed a very important collection amongst which figure forty two flower paintings by Fantin Batour, pictures by Sisley, Monet, Reneir, etc. He died in 1935 and three years after his death, his widow and sen sold no the painting. I have never exhibited the picture, either in my gallery of Paris, Lendon or here.

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
