Thank you for your letter of the 15th. I am awfully sorry that you did not find it possible to make a reduction in the price of the Courbet to the Museum. Quite frankly, the only price that was ever quoted to me was \$35,000 which, not without reason, I took to be a round asking sum that you would be willing to reduce in the case of a museum purchase. I have discussed your letter with our Treasurer and he tells me he will have to find money in some other fund to make up the balance.

I think Miss Walters and Mr. Alexandre will remember that none of us were satisfied with the frame on the painting. While we found that the style of the frame was quite appropriate, we all agreed that it was too massive and quite overpowered the picture. I am sure you will want us to be satisfied in this regard, and I should like to leave it to your own good judgment to select a frame to replace the present one. Would it be necessary for us to return the picture to you for this purpose, or can you visualize the picture well enough to select a new frame without it?

Again let me say how very happy I am to have this great expression of Courbet's genius added to the collection of the Boston Museum.


