The Knaths show has reached us promptly and is now being installed for an opening August 6. It is a really splendid show and will receive considerable attention in this area. August 10 is the date of a lecture in relation to the exhibition.

I am sorry to inform you of damage to "Mary Day." There is a hole about 3/8" in diameter in the center of the canvas and about 12" from the bottom. This was discovered soon after the picture was unpacked and apparently it arrived in this condition. The damage does not appear to be the result of shipping. All other pictures are in good shape with the minor exception of some looseness due to stretcher frames being poorly adjusted to the canvases.

The damage to "Mary Day" is not conspicious enough to withdraw the painting from the show. It can be noticed only upon close inspection and can be repaired without too much effort. Naturally, we are leaving the repairing to the artist. I would suppose Des Moine's insurance coverage would compensate for the cost.

We are so happy to have Karl Knath's work to exhibit for the benefit of our contemporary-minded audience in San Diego. Of course, many will receive it like a sock in the eye but we feel it will make all of us more aware of the importance of the artist in the history of contemporary art.





Accidents of this kind do happen, and we appreciate your efforts in trying to rectify this situation.

After your insurance company has examined the demaged painting, and have been informed that the picture fell in your gallery, will you kindly have the picture returned to us. We will contact a restorer who will let us know \*\*LL\*\* cost of the repair, and we will also have to establish the depreciation of the painting. When we have the information we will notify you so that you can make the necessary arrangements with your insurance company.

If the picture is in such a condition that it cannot be restored we might have to claim for the full insurance value. However, we will let you know the complete result after the picture is examined.

We regret the incident but we are confident that we will be able to settle the matter to the satisfaction of everyone conferned.
